I fielded a couple questions about the use of baked, leftover Class A hardware spares still on the shelf from the initial detector build or intermediate installations over the last few years.

I see no reason we cannot just use it, providing its packaging and labeling remain intact and its original certs indeed qualified it for installation. In other words I don't see any shelf life issue.

However I agreed to ask whether the VRB agrees.

For concreteness, we're talking about a few mounts and some glass beam dumps.
